## About Sault Ste. Marie



Situated on the St. Mary's River between Lake Huron and Lake Superior, Sault Ste. Marie is surrounded by wilderness perfect for the outdoor enthusiast. From skiing, snowshoeing and ice fishing to swimming, boating and hiking, our city has it all. The diversity of our climate allows residents to experience unique outdoor activities in all four seasons. Sault Ste. Marie also has all the amenities of a large city, with access to culture and a diverse heritage, all within a medium-sized Northern Ontario community.

Sault Ste. Marie is naturally gifted. So, too, are its residents. The community is made up of entrepreneurs, artists, innovators and professionals. Astronaut and artist Dr. Roberta Bondar, artist Ken Danby and hockey great Ted Nolan are just some of the iconic figures that have emerged from Sault Ste. Marie and area. Local entrepreneurs, such as Forest BioProducts Inc., are exploring the possibilities of alternative energy, and Brookfield Power – architects of the largest wind energy farm in Canada, located northwest of Sault Ste. Marie – continue to explore the advantages of renewable energy investment. Essar Steel Algoma Inc. – a major industry in the community – remains a leading manufacturer of steel, while TenarisAlgomaTubes – a supplier of tubular products and services – competes in the international market.

With an educational system that spans from preschool to post-secondary, Sault Ste. Marie contributes to the growing global knowledge base. Multiple scientific research facilities, such as the Great Lakes Forestry Centre and the Ontario Forestry Research Institute, make the community a place of innovation and forward-thinking. Sault Ste. Marie continues to be a place of environmental and socio-economic innovation with gifted individuals working to establish a sustainable future.

Commonly referred to as the “Twin Saults, Sault Ste. Marie, Ontario, Canada and Sault Ste. Marie, Michigan, United States are connected by the International Bridge. The span was constructed over the St. Mary's River to allow for easier travel between the two countries. Located beneath the bridge are the Soo (Sault) Locks, which bypass the rapids of the St. Mary's River, where the water falls seven metres (21 feet) from Lake Superior. The locks are the busiest in the world, passing an average of 12,000 ships (“boats” in Great Lakes parlance) per year, which is achieved in spite of their closure from January through March when ice shuts down shipping on the Great Lakes.<sup>1</sup>

## Using The Telephone Book / Yellow Pages



The Sault Ste. Marie and area telephone book is distributed free of charge to every home and business in the city. It functions as an excellent source of contact information for local organizations and individuals. To receive a copy or request additional copies of the local yellow book directory, call 1-866-955-0557. An electronic version of the telephone book is available online at [www.canada411.ca](http://www.canada411.ca), where you can search for community contact information. You may search by category, keyword, business, person's name, telephone number, address, province and proximity.

The traditional textbook version of the telephone book is divided into three sections: white pages, blue pages and yellow pages. The white section lists people and businesses in the city in alphabetical order by last name, including their phone number and street address. The blue pages list government offices, their phone numbers and contact information. Lastly, the Yellow Pages list businesses by subject. For example, to locate businesses that serve pizza, look up "Pizza," and you will find a list of area businesses that provide pizza.

The Ontario Health Insurance Plan (OHIP) is a basic medical plan financed through the collection of taxes by the federal and provincial governments. OHIP provides most basic and emergency health services free of charge to residents of Ontario. It is important that you apply for a health card through OHIP as soon as you have arrived in Ontario since your coverage will begin after you have lived here for three months.

Note: Since you will not have medical coverage for that time, it is advisable to purchase a health insurance plan with a private company. To view a list of private insurance companies, go to [www.settlement.org/FD/07](http://www.settlement.org/FD/07). Be sure to purchase this insurance within five days of arriving in Ontario, otherwise private companies may not provide coverage for you.
